

# Housing

## Fall 2004

UW System Board of Regents policy states that all freshmen and sophomore students must live in the residence halls unless they meet established criteria for exemption. Request for exemption forms are provided to all students after their admission to the university.

### At UWP, there are 9 residence halls:

- 7 are co-ed
- 1 is all female
- 1 is all male

### Each hall is equipped with:

- 24 hour access computer lab
- Main Desk
- Weight Room
- Laundry Facility
- Study areas/lounges
- Microwave room on each wing
- Kitchen (bsmt) or kitchenettes on wings
- Vending area
- TV lounge area(s)
- Recreation area
- Conference/meeting room

### A residence hall room comes complete with:

- Two stackable beds
- Two dressers
- Two desks and chairs
- Two bookcases
- Two internet access ports
- Refrigerator (4.0 cubic foot)
- Carpeting
- Cable TV hook-up
- Telephone line/local service

### Each residence hall is staffed by:

- Resident Director
- Resident Assistants
- Custodian
- Student employees
- Maintenance staff

## FAQ's about Housing:

**Q:** *When will I receive housing information for the following fall?*

**A:** Housing information is sent out after a student receives their official admission letter from UWP.

**Q:** *What do I need to return to apply for a residence hall space?*

**A:** You need to submit the completed residence hall application and the \$100 advance payment to Student Housing.

**Q:** *I would like to live with another incoming new student who will attend UWP. What do I do?*

**A:** There is a space to indicate a roommate preference on the application. Students wanting to be assigned together are instructed to send both housing applications and prepayments in the same envelope to increase the possibility of sharing a residence hall room. Assignments are made based on the date order that completed applications are received. You are encouraged to submit the applications immediately upon admission. The likelihood of having available space together decreases significantly as time goes on. We anticipate very high occupancy levels for the next several years.

**Q:** *When will I receive my housing and roommate assignment?*

**A:** Housing information and assignments are sent in June (typically mid-June).

**Q:** *When can I move into the residence halls?*

**A:** New students and transfers are given the opportunity to move into their residence hall before returning students move in. New students are strongly encouraged to participate in orientation activities.
