

**Course-to-Course Articulation Agreement University of Wisconsin-Platteville and  
Madison Area Technical College Criminal Justice-Law Enforcement**

Currently UWP accepts up to 30 credits (including math and sciences) that are applied to the general education coursework. This agreement facilitates an additional transfer of credits from the Criminal Justice-Law Enforcement Degree Program at MATC to the Criminal Justice Bachelor of Science Degree at UWP.

**OTHER:**

1. In order for these courses to transfer, the student must have completed the courses within the last 15 academic years of when a student is admitted to UWP and earned a grade of "C" or better.
2. The maximum number of credits that can be transferred from a Wisconsin Technical College is 72 credits, of which up to 30 are applicable to the general education requirements.
3. The UWP baccalaureate degree candidate must meet all the general education requirements of the University.
